At that time, I could not have told you in which country Mount Kilimanjaro was located. # Three Acts of Mercy

Spreading Hope and Love During the Christmas Season

During the Christmas season, the Hidden with Christ Ministries team, through its "Rehema Projects," took to heart the true meaning of mercy by reaching out to those in need. In this season of giving, we were privileged to perform three significant acts of mercy that touched lives, brought hope, and reminded many of the powerful presence of God's love. These acts of compassion reflect the essence of what it means to give selflessly and bring light to the darkest places.

## **Blessing the Prisoners of Karanga**

One of the most humbling acts of mercy took place at Karanga Prison, where the Hidden with Christ Ministries team visited 900 prisoners, including both remand prisoners and those serving out their sentences.

Among them were 850 men and 50 women who received gifts that brought joy to their hearts. The gifts we brought may seem very meager and unimportant to those outside a prison setting, but they spoke volumes to the recipients.

Project Manager, Sunday Joseph, traveled to the big commercial city of Dar es Salaam, to purchase 900 pairs of rubber sandals from the wholesale District. He also purchased 900 packages of chocolate and vanilla sandwich cookies so that each prisoner could receive something sweet for Christmas. The final gift was one designed to help the staff of the prison, who are tasked with keeping the prisoners' heads shaved for hygiene purposes. Three professional hair shavers were purchased, two for the men's side and one for the women's side of the prison. (We had been informed that the ones they were using had recently broken.)

We had received information that many of the prisoners had no footwear of any kind. So, our

For many, these simple items were more than just gifts; they were symbols of God's love and mercy, a reminder that no prison wall can hinder God's loving hand from reaching them, as the love of God knows no boundaries. They expressed their gratitude, acknowledging that while they may be physically confined, their spirits were uplifted by the kindness shown.

The head prisoner was allowed to address us, and he shared some profound words that touched our hearts. He said, "**When you leave, we must remain behind these prison walls...but today we saw that God's love is able to penetrate those walls. We are prisoners with you; the only difference is that you are prisoners of God's love toward us.**"

They thanked all those who contributed and asked God to remember and bless those who made this Christmas a little brighter for them.

## **Spreading Hope at the Juvenile Detention Center**

In another act of mercy, the Rehema Project team visited a local Juvenile Detention Center, where teenage offenders are housed. We brought rubber sandals, chocolate and vanilla cookies, and candy to 8 young residents, seven boys and one girl, all between the ages of 13 and 15. One of our own Treasures of Africa KIDZ, Innocent, spoke to them about how God had transformed his life from

being a street child to a college graduate. His message was simple yet profound. He encouraged them to believe in the possibility of change. He assured them that, with God's help, they too could leave their difficult circumstances behind and step into a new life as productive, positive members of society. His words brought smiles in their faces and served as a powerful reminder of God's ability to change hearts and transform lives.

## **Answering the Call for the Vulnerable**

The final act of mercy was an urgent intervention to help victims of domestic violence and sexual abuse. A Municipal social worker reached out, sharing an emergency need for food at a safe house that was running out of supplies. The team acted swiftly, providing enough food to sustain them for an entire month. The women and children at the safe house expressed their deep gratitude, as they had not eaten anything since morning and had no resources to prepare a meal. The food provided not only satisfied their physical hunger but also nourished their spirits,

offering a glimmer of hope that they were not forgotten and that someone cared for their well-being.

Located just south of the Equator, Tanzania's weather is generally hot, with two rainy seasons each year. November and December bring what is called the "short rains." The rainfall is not as intense as the "long rains" which occur from March to May. But the overcast skies temper the heat, and the additional moisture causes the beautiful "Krismasi" tree to bloom and herald the coming of Christmas. The other benefit of those rains is the beautiful snow that blankets Mt. Kilimanjaro. But often during the rainy season, many days may pass before the clouds clear enough to reveal the top of that majestic mountain. When those clouds eventually part, the view of snowcapped Mt. Kilimanjaro against the vibrant African sky is nothing less than breathtaking.

During this time of year, many graduations occur from the nation's colleges and universities. I returned to Tanzania in November to celebrate the accomplishment of one special student. She had come to live at Treasures of Africa Children's Home during the year of its inception, 2007. She had been schooled from Primary to Secondary and then on to college, by the consistent generosity of so many people for so many years. Pondering that truth as I traveled, I wondered how to put into words **the power of persistent generosity**. I could see its result in the face of this amazing young lady. Her life had been transformed from the tragedy that brought her to our orphanage, to a confident dignity that she never would have possessed without such divine intervention. But how could I verbalize the depth of its impact? (you can read her story on pages 9 and 10)

I also thought deeply about the changes in the country over the past twenty-two years. One remarkable advancement was the introduction of the very first electric train on the African continent. It opened for service in Tanzania in early 2024. We used that train to travel from the largest city, Dar es Salaam, to the city of Morogoro in the Southern Highlands of Tanzania, where our student, Glory, was graduating from Mzumbe University.

Previously, getting to Morogoro was slow and difficult, as the road from Dar es Salaam was a long narrow two lane highway often littered with truck accidents and fraught with safety hazards. The drive from Dar es Salaam took three and a half hours on a good day, and several more hours if any accidents were encountered. The new train service took less than two hours and was a smooth and very pleasant ride.

But the stark contrasts in the nation became painfully obvious as we moved across the countryside via this modern conveyance. From the elevated train platform an endless view of impoverished dwellings with rusty tin roofs could be seen as we whisked by in the quiet and comfortable cabin of the electric train.

When we arrived in Morogoro, we took a taxi to the hotel where we would stay until Glory's graduation was completed. When the hotel clerk handed me my room key, I smiled. The room number was 111. I immediately thought of the Bible verse, Hebrews 11:1. It was so fitting to the purpose of this trip.

***Faith, therefore, is the substance of things waited for, the evidence of things not seen...***

Hebrews 11:1 (Jubilee Bible)

We had come to Morogoro to see the substance of our faith – the things we had believed we would see and had long waited for – children from Treasures of Africa Children's Home becoming leaders for their nation. Glory's University graduation was part of that substance!

But before I returned to the U.S. in December, there was one more victory I wanted to see. This would require another bit of traveling, a total of 8 hours of driving roundtrip. It would take us out to the Maasai tribal area by Lake Manyara, and it was for the sake of a single soul.

In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus talked about the shepherd who would leave the 99 sheep in the wilderness to go and find the one which was lost. I felt like this case was one of those moments, and that Jesus Himself would take the time to do the same. So, Pastor Kioko and I spent the day driving to find that one sheep.

His name was Osekeri, and he was an elder in the Maasai tribe. We had spoken to him in October when we had visited the Maasai church he attended with a ministry team from the USA. The Lord had spoken to me about him and instructed me to ask him a direct question, "Have you ever fully surrendered your life to the Lord?" I hesitated because I knew he attended the church, having seen him there many times. But the instructions were so specific, I simply obeyed. His answer should not have surprised me. He admitted that though he considered himself a church member, he had never surrendered his life completely to the Lord. His reasons were many, including his own struggle with walking away from some Maasai cultural traditions which conflicted with the Bible. After a long discussion, he promised that upon our next visit, he would be ready to pray with us and give himself completely to the Lord. I told him that we would pray for his protection so that he would live until we returned.

Now that I was back in Tanzania, I knew it was time to keep my promise to meet Osekeri and pray with him. When he was told by his pastor that we were on the way to see him, he replied, "Glory to God!" When we arrived, Osekeri met us with a big smile. There was no resistance at all in his heart, as he had prepared himself to receive the Lord and be born again. He explained how he prayed morning and night, with the simple prayer, "Lord, lead me by my hand." He had intended that day to go visit family members who lived a distance away but circumstances prevented him from leaving. He was sure this was the hand of God stopping him, when he received the message that we were on the way to meet him.

Osekeri eagerly prayed to receive Christ as his Savior with a beautiful simplicity. When he lifted his head, his face was shining. He immediately expressed concern about his family and suggested we plan to return to share this "good news" with those living in his boma (homestead) and even promised to gather his neighbors as well. We drove the four hours back to Moshi with great joy over the one sheep that had been lost but now was found.

# Glory's Victory

This past November I made the long journey to Tanzania with my wife Rita Langeland to celebrate a very special occasion with one of our TOA college students, Glory Ngowi. Glory was preparing for her graduation from Mzumbe University in Morogoro, Tanzania.

Here is a little bit of Glory's background that will help you appreciate this important milestone in her life. This is a milestone we are calling "Glory's Victory!" Glory was one of the first children to be admitted to Treasures of Africa Children's Home when its doors first opened in March of 2007. She was 7 years old when she started living at TOA. Her father had died, and her mother was unable to care for her and her 9-year-old sister Helena. They had been living with elderly grandparents. Another family member, who was financially unable to care for them, but concerned about their well-being, brought their situation to the attention of the Social Welfare authorities and Glory and her sister were brought to live at Treasures of Africa.

Glory was always a diligent student who took her opportunity to study seriously. A few days before her graduation Glory shared with me that at one stage in her education she had received grades that were too low to move forward in the Tanzanian education system. She was given the choice to repeat the grade level or begin to pursue vocational training that would prepare her for a specific career path. After consulting with the TOA staff and seeking God's guidance she chose to repeat the grade level even though she knew it would subject her to ridicule from other students.

She believed that God would honor her willingness to humble herself and help her hold on to the goal of one day graduating from college. Glory renewed her commitment to study hard and by the end of the next school year she had earned the top student ranking in her grade level. She said that God used that very humbling experience to help her develop strong academic habits and the self discipline needed for university level education as well as strengthening her trust in the Lord.

Every one of our TOA KIDZ is a treasure and each one has unique challenges that they must learn to overcome. Glory's victory is a story from which we can all take encouragement. Please read her heartfelt and beautifully written thank you letter on the next page.

Rita and I also say "thank you" to each of the generous donors and prayer partners who made it possible for Glory to receive a safe loving environment as a young girl and an excellent education from first grade through University level.

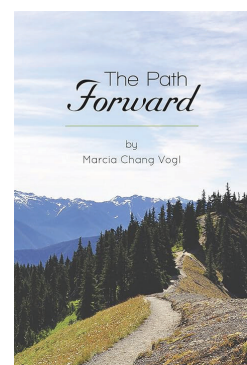
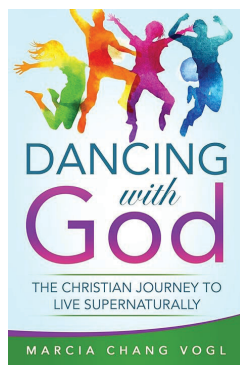
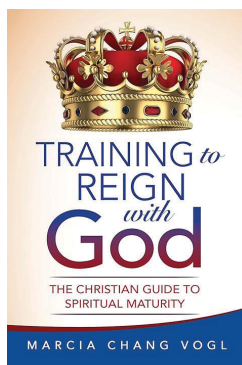

# 2025: THE YEAR OF THE UNPRECEDENTED

**un-prec-e-dent-ed** (ŭn-prĕs-ĭ-dĕn'tĭd) having no precedent; unparalleled; never previously done, known or experienced (Oxford English Dictionary, Oxford University Press)

When I asked the Lord about this new year of 2025, I kept hearing a single word: UNPRECEDENTED. I pondered and prayed about the implications of such a word and then finally decided to see if that word was ever used in the Bible. I found a single instance of its use in a couple of English Bible translations of Numbers 16:30.

***But if the Lord brings about something unprecedented....***

Numbers 16:30 (Holman Christian Standard Bible)

I will give you the full verse momentarily, but first – the context. The children of Israel had come out of slavery in Egypt, led by a God appointed leader – Moses. It had not been an easy trek through the wilderness toward the Promised Land, but God kept helping and providing for them during the journey. Some of the men confronted Moses and his brother Aaron, questioning their leadership and trying to insert themselves into the positions God had given exclusively to Moses and Aaron. God was not happy about that, and told Moses that He would deal with it in a spectacular (unprecedented) way. So, Moses told the people who were watching the confrontation – to back away from the tents of those rebellious men.

***<sup>26</sup>He warned the community, “Get away now from the tents of these wicked men. Don’t touch anything that belongs to them, or you will be swept away because of all their sins.”<sup>27</sup> So they got away from the dwellings of Korah, Dathan, and Abiram. Meanwhile, Dathan and Abiram came out and stood at the entrance of their tents with their wives, children, and infants.***

***<sup>28</sup> Then Moses said, “This is how you will know that the Lord sent me to do all these things and that it was not of my own will: <sup>29</sup>If these men die naturally as all people would, and suffer the fate of all, then the Lord has not sent me. <sup>30</sup>But if the Lord brings about something unprecedented, and the ground opens its mouth and swallows them along with all that belongs to them so that they go down alive into Sheol, then you will know that these men have despised the Lord.”***

***<sup>31</sup> Just as he finished speaking all these words, the ground beneath them split open. <sup>32</sup> The earth opened its mouth and swallowed them and their households, all Korah’s people, and all their possessions. <sup>33</sup> They went down alive into Sheol with all that belonged to them. The earth closed over them, and they vanished from the assembly.***

Numbers 16:26-33 (Holman Christian Standard Bible)

Before you allow fear to grip you about 2025 being filled with negative unprecedented events like this one – consider what the Lord showed me about this incident.

1. This harsh judgment came only upon people who had “despised the Lord.” (Num. 16:30)
2. God warned the innocent people in advance so they could be safe. (Num. 16:26)

With regard to 2025, I do believe we will see some unheard of and unparalleled events in the earth. The Bible clearly states that as the end times grow closer, perilous times will come. (2 Timothy 3:1) But for those who love and follow the Lord closely, there does not need to be any fear. However, it will be essential to stay close to the Lord and listen to His voice in all decisions that you make, especially involving travel. God knows the future and will protect you if you ask Him before making any major decision. I recall reading a vivid example of this type of protection from an incident which occurred during World War II. It is taken from a book entitled, “Evidence Not Seen,” by Darlene Deibler Rose.

A missions organization informed its missionaries it was ready to evacuate them from Indonesia as the war was creeping ever closer to the islands. A boat which was evacuating others, had been arranged to carry them out of harms way. All of the missionaries prayed, asking the Lord whether they should leave on that boat. Every single missionary felt led to remain. The boat left without them and not long afterwards was torpedoed and sank. There were no survivors. God will advise you if you ask Him for wisdom in every decision!

If you consider the entire text of the Bible and examine the “unprecedented events” that God brought to pass, you will find that the majority were miraculous acts of healing, deliverance from danger, supernatural provision, or miraculous breakthroughs. Here are a few examples of the intervention of God which were all UNPRECEDENTED:

1. **MIRACULOUS HEALINGS**: Jesus performed many miraculous healings while he walked on the earth. John 9 records the healing of a man born blind, which by the words of the man who was healed, was unprecedented! Since the beginning of time, it has never been heard that anyone opened the eyes of a person born blind. (John 9:32)
2. **DELIVERANCE** from unjust persecution: God sent an angel to break the apostle Peter out of jail because King Herod was planning to try him and then execute him. (Acts 12:1-17)
3. **DELIVERANCE** from enemies: After the Israelites marched out of Egypt with Pharaoh’s permission, the Egyptian leader had a sudden change of heart realizing he just lost his entire slave labor force. So, he sent his entire army on horseback and in chariots to chase the Israelites and force them to return to Egypt. God did the unprecedented miracle of splitting the Red Sea, allowing the Israelites to walk through it as if on dry ground. When the Egyptians tried to follow, the water returned to cover them, and they were all drowned. (Exodus 14:10; 21-29)
4. **PROVISION** of food: Manna was sent from heaven which lasted 40 years as the Israelites journeyed through the wilderness and fed an estimated number of more than one million souls each day. (Exodus 16)
5. **PROVISION** of water: The Israelites came to a place in their wilderness journey where there was no water to be found for their families or their animals. God instructed Moses to go to a certain rock and strike it with his staff. God caused a supernatural flow of water to come forth from a rock and fully satisfied their thirst. (Exodus 17:1-6)
6. **MIRACULOUS BREAKTHROUGH**: After the death of Moses, his protégé, Joshua, was leading the people of Israel toward the Promised Land. They faced a major blockade, a walled city whose soldiers were not going to allow them to pass. They needed a miracle because they were not warriors, they were a ragtag group of descendants of former slaves with young families. God instructed Joshua to have the people march in silence around the walls of the city for six days. On the seventh day they marched around the city seven times and then gave a shout of victory. God caused the walls of Jericho to supernaturally fall down, giving them the miraculous breakthrough they desperately needed. (Joshua 6:1-20)

These six examples are all UNPRECEDENTED historical occurrences. They are supernatural interventions of God that had never been seen or heard of before. They brought miraculous healing, deliverance, provision and breakthrough for God’s people in both the Old and New Testaments. God wants you to experience the unprecedented intervention of God in your life in 2025.
